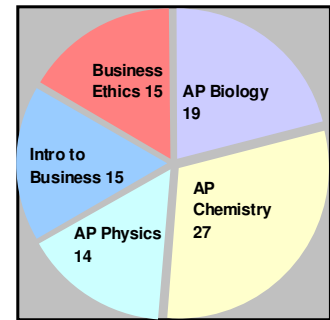
MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Chardon Local Schools is high achievement for all students, where learning is our most important work.

THE SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Chardon High School is a four-year, comprehensive high school located in Chardon, Ohio. Chardon is located approximately 30 miles east of Cleveland in a suburban/rural community consisting of Middle/Upper Middle class families. Current enrollment is 995 students: 94% Caucasian with a gender breakdown of 51% male and 49% female. Chardon High School is a member of the Auburn Career Center Joint Vocational Consortium and a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools

Chardon offers a vast array of high level courses including 15 Advanced Placement courses, Independent Study/ Credit Flex options, and partnerships with local colleges to offer students College Credit Plus opportunities. Through College Credit Plus, students have the opportunity to earn college credit through dual enrollment courses offered within our building. Students enrolled in AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, Introduction to Business, and Business Ethics will be eligible to earn up to 29 college credits for successful completion of these courses.



CCP Dual Enrollments

Chardon High School has demonstrated a strong dedication to outstanding academic performance. Our students have consistently outperformed the Ohio and National averages of the ACT, SAT, and Advanced Placement (AP) exams. Chardon High School earned a Silver Medal from *US News and World Report* as one of *America's Top High Schools* in 2014 and has been recognized by *Newsweek* as one of *America's Top High Schools* in 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.

GRADUATION & DIPLOMA OPTIONS

Chardon High School and the Ohio Department of Education require a minimum of 20 credits for graduation. The academic program is organized into seven 48-minute class period per day. Students are required to take a minimum of 5 full-value courses each semester. Courses meet for 18 weeks each semester, with ½ credit awarded for successful completion of a semester course and 1 credit awarded for successful completion of a full year course.

In addition, students are required to pass 5 Ohio Graduation Tests (OGT) in Reading, Writing, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies

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COMPUTING GPA & CLASS RANK

Grade point averages are based upon a four point scale as follows:

A: 90%-100% B: 80%-89% C: 70%-79% D: 60%-69%

The final grade for a course is determined by averaging the course GPA of the 4 grading periods and the final exam.

A: 3.50 or above B: 2.50-3.49 C: 1.50-2.49 D: 0.50-1.49

Chardon High School DOES NOT weight course grades based upon enrolling in a regular education, College Prep, Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), or College Credit Plus course. The maximum possible GPA is 4.00. Class rank is determined by this overall, non-weighted cumulative GPA. More than one student may share a class rank, including that of Valedictorian and Salutatorian.

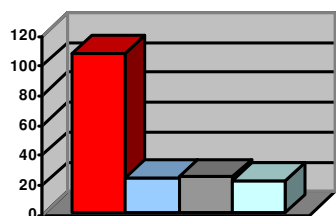

Chardon High School will be offering two new Advanced Placement courses in AP Computer Science and AP Psychology during the 2016-2017 school year.
