The mission of the Chardon Local Schools is high achievement for all students, where learning is our most important work.

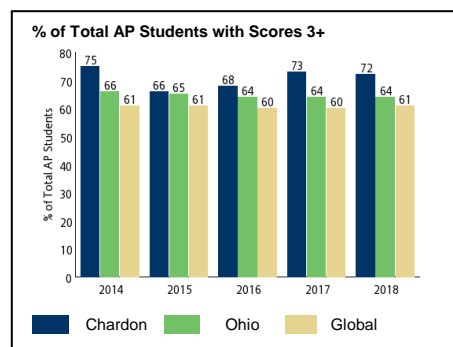
THE SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Chardon High School is a four-year, comprehensive high school located in Chardon, Ohio. Chardon is located approximately 30 miles east of Cleveland in a suburban/rural community consisting of Middle/Upper Middle class families. Current enrollment in grades 9-12 is 968 students: 93% Caucasian. Chardon Local Schools revamped the district for the 18-19 school year in which Chardon High School will now be a grade 8-12 building. This allows the 251, 8th grade students, opportunities to take additional courses for high school credit during their 8th grade year. In order to build upon this opportunity, CHS created a specialized learning opportunity for the 8th grade students titled the Circuit of Success. This program will build upon Chardon's Core Values.

Chardon High School is a member of the Auburn Career Center Joint Vocational Consortium and a member of the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. Chardon participates as a member of the Western Reserve Conference.

Chardon offers a vast array of high level courses including 18 Advanced Placement courses, 19 Honors courses, Independent Study / Credit Flex options, and partnerships with local colleges to offer students College Credit Plus opportunities.

Chardon High School has demonstrated a strong dedication to outstanding academic performance. Our students have consistently outperformed the Ohio and National averages of the ACT, SAT, and Advanced Placement (AP) exams. Chardon High School earned a Silver Medal from US News and World Report as one of *America's Top High Schools* in 2016 and has been recognized by Newsweek as one of *America's Top High Schools* for the past five years.



GRADUATION & DIPLOMA OPTIONS

Chardon High School and the Ohio Department of Education require a minimum of 20 credits for graduation. The academic program is run through a modified block schedule, which includes three, 47-minute class periods and one, 94-minute block period each week. Courses meet for 18 weeks each semester, with ½ credit awarded for successful completion of a semester course and 1 credit awarded for successful completion of a full year course.

In addition, students are required to earn a total of 18 points through End-of-Course Exams in English I, English II, Algebra I, Geometry, Biology, US History, and US Government.

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COMPUTING GPA & CLASS RANK

Grade point averages are based on a four-point scale as follows:

A: 90%-100% B: 80%-89% C: 70%-79% D: 60%-69%

The final grade for a course is determined by averaging the course GPA of the 4 grading periods and the final exam.

A: 3.50 or above B: 2.50-3.49 C: 1.50-2.49 D: 0.50-1.49

Chardon High School DOES NOT weight course grades based upon enrolling in a regular education, College Prep, Honors, Advanced Placement (AP), or College Credit Plus course. The maximum possible GPA is 4.00. *Class rank is determined by the overall, non-weighted cumulative GPA.* More than one student may share a class rank, including that of Valedictorian and Salutatorian.

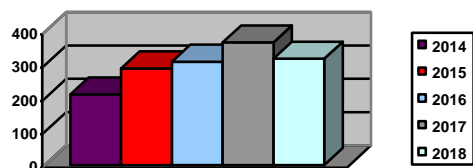
